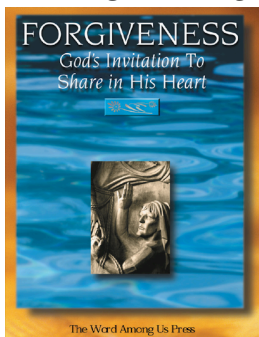

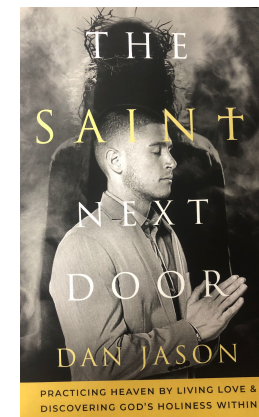
Small beads: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.


In Conclusion, 3 times: Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

<p>Ash Wednesday & Good Friday are days of fasting for Catholics between 18 & 59. Fridays are days of abstinence from meat for all Catholics 14 & older.</p> <p>Aside from age, those excused from fast & abstinence include pregnant or nursing women, the physically or mentally ill, including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. In all cases, common sense should prevail.</p> <p>If you cannot participate in fasting and abstinence, find another way to practice penance!</p>
