At July 31<sup>st</sup>, we came to the end of another fiscal year, and while we are in the process of getting the numbers finalized for 2022-2023 for Blessed Sacrament Church, our School, the Shrine Church, and the Sister Maureen Joyce Center, which we will report on in October, we want to provide the previous years' financial data now, along with a summary of the sacraments and events from 2021-2022.

I am grateful for all our finance council does, watching over our income, spending, and investments.

As you can see, a not-insignificant part of the parish's money comes from large donations, often bequests left for us in a will. For this I am very grateful, and I ask us all to consider leaving a little something for Blessed Sacrament, the Shrine, the School, or the Sister Maureen Joyce Center in our wills.

Notice also that although school tuition funds the school, a significant part of the school's finances comes from grants, fundraisers such as the Fall Family Festival, and government title money.

Although both the parish and the school ended in the red last year, due to circumstances such as the pandemic and changing demographics, we thankfully have savings that could absorb that blow. A portion of donations to the Building Fund, the School Alumni Fund, and the Tuition Assistance Fund goes into our savings and investments, so that it is available for years such as this.

On a different note, it can feel like there are always more funerals than there are baptisms and weddings. This may be because there is nothing more certain than death and taxes. Once one has received the "final committal," (in the words of the funeral rite), there is no turning back. But there is more and more trepidation nowadays to being committed, and the promises of baptism and the vows of marriage (and also of ordination!) certainly commit us. By our vows we are obliged to one another and to God, giving 100% to the promises that we make (and 10% financially, the traditional "tithe"). And it's much more beautiful and fulfilling to be committed than to be non-committal, because when we're not committed, things don't last: marriages, parishes, or movements. And the Church is a movement, a force for the salvation of the world, moved by the Holy Spirit, in the Church, in all of us.

Although this document gives us a moment to reflect on the past year, let us commit ourselves to the next year, to the future, to what God has next for us. And let us be completely at His service.
