Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In today's Gospel (Matthew 25:14-30), a master entrusts his servants with talents according to their abilities. The talents represent the various gifts and abilities that God has bestowed upon each one of us. The master expects the servants to use these talents wisely during his absence. This responsibility highlights the importance of faithful stewardship, using the gifts and abilities that God has given us to bring about a fruitful and abundant harvest. The first two servants use the abilities to do good and build God's kingdom. But the third servant failed to recognize the trust that the master had placed in him and, in fear, neglected the opportunity to use his talents for the master's benefit. This parable invites us to consider how we are using the talents and gifts that God has given us. Are we actively investing them for the benefit of God's kingdom, or are we burying them in fear or complacency? Each one of us is uniquely gifted by God, and our call is to discover, develop, and deploy these gifts for the glory of God and the service of others. Stewardship is not just about managing resources; it's about a disposition of the heart. It's about recognizing that everything we have, including our abilities, belongs to God — and we are called to manage these gifts with faithfulness and diligence. The parable challenges us to step out of our comfort zones, take risks, and invest in the work of God's kingdom.

*Engineering the future: On Wednesday, November 8th, our Future Cities Engineering team was treated to a special visit from

East Coast Power! Our engineering team is working on a project about electricity, and students had lots of great questions for the owner and foreman. They were able to try on some items and watch the bucket truck go high into the air! What a great experience for our future engineers!

*Teacher development: On Tuesday, November 7th, Elementary Education Evolved had the opportunity to deliver a full-day virtual professional development session for teachers in New York, including Blessed Sacrament School faculty! They discussed and practiced unpacking standards, curriculum mapping, and raising rigor.

*Annual Tuition Assistance Drive: Letters have gone out to our regular donors and alumni, but we also appeal to new donors (and everyone!) to support Catholic education for our children. It costs about \$10,000 to educate each child in our school for a year. Due to your generosity over the years, we have been able to keep tuition relatively low. A child in Grades K-8 is \$5,000; a second child in the same family is \$2,100; and we ask \$500 for each additional child. Tuition for three- and four-year-olds in preschool is \$5,800. The biggest expense that tuition pays for is our teachers. Right now, our teachers' salaries average is only \$39,000, and we would like to be able to pay more reasonable and competitive salaries in the future. We have received a grant from the Mons Concepit Foundation, which will match all donations received for the school between October 1st and December 31st up to \$125,000! Please consider helping us achieve this goal! Families and businesses might also consider being part of our Blessed Sacrament Angel Program, which supports a specific child or family for multiple years.

Food Pantry We are now collecting socks for men, women, and children. Our food pantry is open Mondays and Thursdays, 10-11:30 a.m. Thank you for your support!

The Boutique We will be accepting donations the Friday after Thanksgiving. We need **all sizes of infant and children's shoes & clothing!** We also need men's shoes and coats as well as men's pants in sizes 28-34 and men's shirts in sizes S and M. The Boutique is open Saturdays, 9 a.m.-noon, and accepts donations on Tuesdays and Fridays, 9 a.m.-noon. We cannot accept books, some electronics, fabric scraps, or clothing that needs repair or is dirty.
