

FROM THE DEACON'S BENCH

The events of Jesus's Passion are proclaimed in their entirety in today's Liturgy of the Word. Those events will be proclaimed again when we celebrate the liturgies of the Triduum — Holy Thursday's Mass of the Lord's Supper, Good Friday of the Lord's Passion, and the Easter Vigil. In communities that celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation with catechumens, these liturgies take on special importance because they invite the catechumens and the parish



community to enter together into the central mysteries of our faith. These days are holiest of all days.

On this Palm Sunday, we read from Mark's Gospel. On Good Friday, we will read the Passion of Jesus from the Gospel of John. The story of the Last Supper is told in all four Passion stories. This was the Passover meal in which Jesus becomes the new Paschal Sacrifice. The Passover meal goes back to the time of Moses. The Jews were living in captivity under the Egyptians. God told Moses he would send an angel over the

region to take the firstborn son of the Egyptians. The Jews were to spread lamb's blood on their doors so the angel would "pass over" the homes of the Jews. The Jews then escaped across the Nile. They had to flee quickly, so their bread had no time to rise. This is why the Jews eat unleavened bread. We Catholics do the same, as our Eucharist is a flatbread. The escape from the Egyptians became Passover, a sacred meal the Jews celebrate each year, and this was the Passover meal the Apostles shared at the Last Supper. After this Last Supper, animals will no longer be sacrificed because Jesus became the new sacrifice who offers Himself for all. This is the same Last Supper/First Eucharist that the priest offers at Mass.

When the priest says the words Jesus said at the Last Supper, he does not just represent Christ. The priest is Christ (in persona Christi ... in the person of Christ). The Last Supper is an eternal event. When we are at Mass, we are not watching the Last Supper. We are in that upper room with Jesus and his disciples. The Mass is the actual Last Supper, a continuous salvific event that continues across all time, to today, and until Kingdom come. The Eucharist was not a one-time event that the priest reenacts. When we think of it this way, the Eucharist is the most significant event in out lives. Jesus is present in all the sacraments, but there is no other sacrament where we get to dine with Jesus and eat his flesh and blood. We are right there in that upper room! ~ Deacon Gerry
