# A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Peter, in today's reading from the Acts of the Apostles, refers to a man as "a cripple". Apparently, he didn't get the memo. We don't call people "cripples"; we don't define people or give them titles based on insignificant or often changeable attributes. Every title is too small for defining a human being! A person isn't merely a "cripple," nor even a "banker," "landscaper," "musician," "extrovert," "dog person," or "monster." Especially because things change: even the cripple, miraculously, is no longer a cripple! He is healed! However, there are some titles, based on significant and unchangeable realities, that we can use, and the (perhaps) most important one is the one John uses in his letter that we read today: "we may be called the children of God." This is because "we are God's children now...we shall be like him." This reality, that we are God's children, outshines any job title or derogative name or any other descriptor we apply to ourselves or others. It doesn't even matter how old we are: even if I were to reach 100, I should still understand myself to be one of God's children. I'm not merely one of his creations (though that's true), nor one of his subjects (though that is also true), but one of his children, and as such I have access to our Father's home.
