


HAPPENING IN OUR COMMUNITIES

FROM OUR PAROCHIAL VICAR

Today, we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. A feast that brings the Christmas season to a close. It is fitting that we conclude Christmastide with this wonderful feast, for the Baptism of the Lord reveals in a profound manner the great mystery that was first given to us on Christmas Day when Jesus Christ, the incarnate Word of God, was born.

When Jesus allows himself to be plunged into the dark, cold waters of the Jordan, he does so on behalf of all humanity. And when he emerges from this water, humanity, redeemed and recreated, rises with him. Thus, in Jesus's baptism we see the obscurity of the Old Testament account of the flood becoming clear. An event that would only be truly fulfilled when Jesus undergoes his "baptism," when he is plunged into the waters of death and rises on the third day.

Today's feast, therefore, reveals to us that Jesus - and with Jesus, His Mystical Body the Church – is the true ark by which we are saved from the waters of sin and death. It is Jesus who brings us safely to the shores of the new heavens and the new earth. It is Jesus who is our peace.

Today, therefore, remember your own baptism. Remember that when the water was poured upon your head and the priest or deacon baptized you "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit," you were truly born anew by water and the Holy Spirit. You became a son or daughter in the only begotten Son; a temple of the Holy Spirit; a new creation through the precious blood of Jesus. At your baptism, you were made free. Let's not abuse this freedom, using it, as St. Peter says, as a cloak to commit evil. Rather, let us use this freedom to become truly free by conforming our minds to Christ's, carrying out the work of love that has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, and so become worthy of the name "Christian"; child of God. ~*Fr. 
