# CHILDREN BLESS US BEYOND MEASURE

As a long-time director of parish Faith Formation and now a religion teacher, I have the incredible privilege of hearing such beautiful and inspiring questions and observations from young people as they explore their faith more deeply. Sometimes their sayings make me giggle. Sometimes I don't know the answers to their questions (but I tell them that we can try to find out together!). Sometimes their comments are so thought-provoking that they completely stop me in my tracks. Colleagues often tell me, "I hope you're writing all these down, because you could publish a book!". Who knows maybe I'll do that someday. But in the meantime, I thought that I would share some of the wonderful things that I've heard from children during my many years in ministry.

From a kindergartener: "Do angels in heaven get married and have babies?'

From a sixth grader: "Did Jesus ever get hot? When you see pictures of him, it looks like he's always wearing a long robe. You'd think that he would have gotten really warm because the weather where he lived was super hot. Didn't he ever wear short sleeves?"

From a middle schooler: "Poor Lazarus! He died and then Jesus brought him back to life, but then when he got old, he died again! That guy had to go through death twice! That really sucks!"

From a third grader: "Does God celebrate Lent? Actually, I think that he does. His Lent is probably our everyday.

From a third grader, after studying the parable of The Good Samaritan: "I know there were two criminals who also died on crosses next to Jesus when he was crucified. Were those the two people who didn't stop to take care of the wounded man on the side of the road?"

From a third grader, after studying the Gospel passage where Simeon holds baby Jesus in the temple: "Wouldn't it have been really heavy to hold baby Jesus? Because he had the weight of the world.'

From a second grader, trying to remember the Act of Contrition: "I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Jesus caught the sniffles and died. Thank you, Jesus. Amen!'
