### The Beauty and Blessings of Lent by Lisanne Jensen

"And even though I don't know what your plan is, I know you make beauty from these ashes ..." ~"Broken Hallelujah" by The Afters

Lent is my absolute favorite time of year. I know that might sound crazy to some, considering that this liturgical season is so solemn and serious with a focus on sin and repentance. After all, on Ash Wednesday we hear the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return"—providing us with a stark reminder of our own mortality. How could that possibly be joyful? But still, the night before Ash Wednesday, I feel like a kid at Christmas. I get so excited about embarking on this 40 days of preparation for Easter — and each Lent enriches my faith in such different and meaningful ways.

\*Ash Wednesday. This year, for the first time, I had the amazing honor and blessing of distributing ashes. I didn't realize the huge impact it would have on me. At our 9 a.m. school service, the BSS preschoolers came to church for the first time — and they happened to be on my side for receiving ashes. I got to place ashes on their cute little foreheads! They did great ... some were a bit apprehensive while others boldly came forward and proclaimed a loud "Amen!" afterward! After the service was over, I was totally struck by how I got to make ash crosses on the foreheads of three- and four-yearolds, on older people, on babies, on moms and dads, on personal friends, and all ages in between. It shows how we are truly all connected as one community of faith — as the Body of Christ — and we are all in this together. Really, I feel like we are all just "walking each other home."

\*Giving up something (or adding to). Normally, I do give up something for Lent — but this year, I've decided to actually add a practice instead. On each day of Lent, I'm writing a note of encouragement and positivity to someone and will give these notes to various individuals (especially those who might really need it right now). I want to shine Jesus's light into the world even more by spreading love, kindness, and support. (Hey, one Lent I tried giving up coffee ... let's just say that didn't go well!)

He amazing example for us of quiet leadership, family life, humility, devotion to God, hard work, and steadfast love.

\*Little Black Books. If you get a chance to get your hands on a Little Black Book, definitely take advantage of it! These mini devotionals for Lent offer incredible insight into scripture and Catholicism. They are published by the Diocese of Saginaw, Michigan, and this year's publication reflects on Jesus's life based on the Passion narrative in the Gospel of St. John. The left side of each page in these books offers different forms of prayer, inspiring thoughts, quotes, etc. that are centered around the theme of "hope." The righthand pages contain scripture and questions for reflection. These books really have a way of causing us to think about life and our faith in new and different ways!

\*The great Easter Vigil. It's probably because I went through the RCIA and received the sacraments of baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil ... but the night before Easter is probably one of my most favorite nights! Yes, the Mass is much longer ... but everything about it is unforgettable: the Easter fire being lit ... entering the dark church with only candlelight ... hearing a variety of readings that proclaim our salvation history ... all the lights coming on and singing the Gloria together ... joining the celebration of those who are being baptized and receiving the sacraments ... it's a night unlike any other.
