

# **Pretzels: A Lenten Tradition**

This past week, I taught a fun lesson about pretzels to my BSS religion students. I thought that I would share it with all of you as well!

Around 610 AD, a monk living in either northern Italy or southern France (the exact location is unknown) twisted some leftover bread dough and baked it to create a children's snack. He called treat *pretiola*, which means "little rewards" in Latin. Pretzels were often given to children as a prize for learning their prayers.'

A pretzel's shape looks like arms folded in prayer, and the three holes or spaces in a pretzel represent the Holy Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. People who were fasting for Lent often snacked on pretzels because of their simple ingredients. They quickly became a symbol of faith as well as good luck and prosperity. Pretzels were also often given to the poor because they were inexpensive and a way of providing sustenance and spiritual comfort.

German immigrants brought pretzels to the United States (specifically, Pennsylvania). The very first pretzel factory was in Lititz, PA. At first, when pretzels were invented, there were only soft pretzels — not the hard pretzels that are so commonplace these days. Today, about 80 percent of pretzels in the United States come from Pennsylvania!
