HE KNOWS WHAT'S IN OUR HEARTS

Due to the nature of my jobs (director of Faith Formation and school religion teacher), I'm often asked to lead groups in prayer. Sometimes it's a prepared prayer that I've written ahead of time, but usually it's spontaneous (where I'm just "winging it" and letting the Holy Spirit take over). Either way, it's one of my favorite things to do — but that wasn't always the case!

Before I became Catholic and was asking a lot of questions about God and faith, I was a member of a local moms' group. We had small breakout sessions one day, and I was nominated to lead the small group in prayer. I instantly felt nervous and shy, and I wasn't sure that I felt comfortable praying out loud in front of everyone. I didn't know the proper words to say. Someone else in the group advised me, "Just say what's in your heart." So, I took a deep breath and did exactly that. Afterward, everyone commented on how heartfelt and genuine my prayer was and how it really inspired them. At that moment, I realized that God just wants to know what's in our hearts — and spending time with him in conversation is the important part, not whether we stumble over our words or don't know what to say or forget to mention something. He just wants that closeness with us.

This weekend's Gospel passage is about prayer. In Luke, one of Jesus's disciples asks him, "Lord, teach us to pray." It's a question that we, too, might have on our minds — how should we be praying? Jesus responds with, "Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us ..." (Luke 11:2-4). Those words sound familiar to us, of course! We know them as The Lord's Prayer (sometimes called the "Our Father"). For children receiving

the sacrament of First Reconciliation, I actually use a beautiful Examination of Conscience that's based on The Lord's Prayer! Christians all over the world know this prayer.

One of my favorite parts of the Our Father is, "Give us this day our daily bread." These words remind me that God always gives us everything we need each day, so we shouldn't be anxious or afraid (I know, that's easier said than done!). We can count on him to provide — and he always seems to answer our prayers beyond what we could have ever imagined!

Even when we pray, and we might not know what to say or what to pray for, we can rest assured that God knows what's in our hearts and will guide us. So, let's do as St. Paul urges us: pray without ceasing! And, "Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God" (Philippians 4:6).
