FAITH FORMATION & YOUTH MINISTRY

Our Confirmation Retreat is this Sunday (October 5th), and I feel incredibly excited to spend the day with our fantastic young people who are saying "yes" to God. Confirmation candidates from All Saints in Albany are also joining us, which will be a great blessing. (Welcome!) All the candidates will have a role in our 9 a.m. Mass (as lectors, gift bearers, etc.). I'm also thinking about the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi, which is this Saturday, October 4th. The "Peace Prayer" is usually attributed to St. Francis, but scholars believe that he likely didn't write the text. Still, it's a popular prayer that we sometimes hear (and sing) at church:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace:
where there is hatred, let me sow love;
where there is injury, pardon;
where there is doubt, faith;
where there is despair, hope;
where there is darkness, light;
where there is sadness, joy.

O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek
to be consoled as to console,
to be understood as to understand,
to be loved as to love.
For it is in giving that we receive,
it is in pardoning that we are pardoned,
and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

Amen.

When our Confirmation candidates are sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit at Confirmation this December, they will be strengthened by the Holy Spirit to do exactly what the above prayer says:

To encourage peace throughout the world and embrace God's peace (which we know "surpasses all understanding")

To spread God's love, especially where negativity and hatred exists

To forgive others who trespass against us, because that's what God does for us

To be a light when all there seems to be is darkness, bringing hope to others

Adopting an attitude of humility and servant-leadership by caring for others' needs Giving more than receiving

None of these things are easy. But if God leads us to something, he will always lead us through it! By virtue of our baptismal call ~ and by the power of the Holy Spirit ~ we are able to serve God and serve each other, growing in faith and providing our lives as an example. Jesus gave that example to us.

If you could, please keep our Confirmation candidates in your prayers. And candidates, please know that our faith community is constantly cheering you on, supporting you, encouraging you, and present for you throughout your faith journeys!




